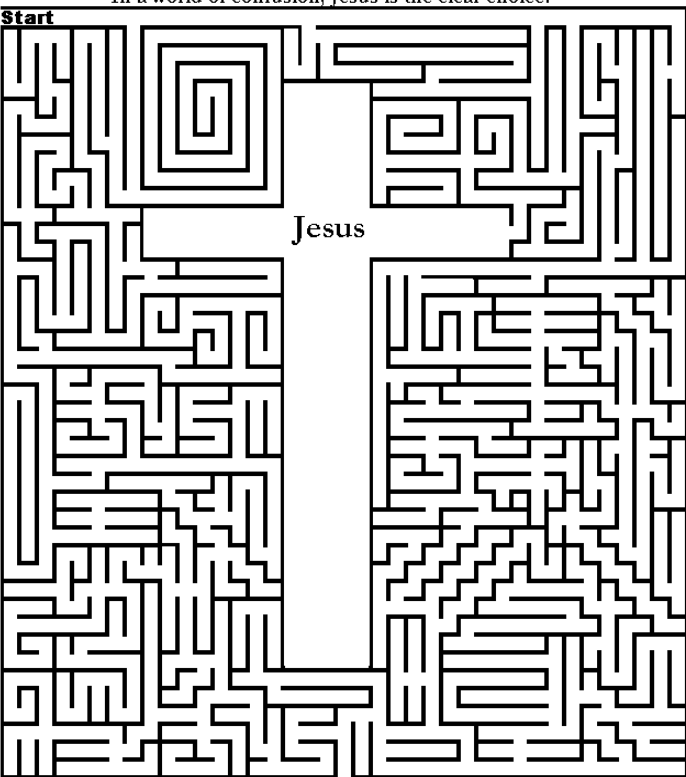

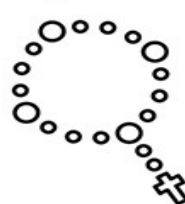

SOCIAL MEDIA LIVE-STREAMING

During this time of pandemic, we at San Martin will make every effort possible to continue providing for the spiritual needs of our community. We invite you to follow us on our Facebook page @SanMartinCatholicChurch to live-stream our daily 5:30 pm Mass and on the weekends we will have 10 am Mass in Spanish and 11 am Mass in English.

TIPS WHILE YOU LIVE-STREAM MASS

1. Pray and look over readings ahead of time: This will help you become familiar with what will be read during the live stream and give you a better engagement into the Mass
2. Choose a live-stream to watch: Several parishes are offering Mass as well and the normally broadcasted Mass on EWTN. San Martin will have live-stream Mass at 10 am in Spanish and 11 am in English.
3. Get dressed: Yes, it is comfortable to be at home and stay in our pajamas during this time of quarantine. However do not forget what you are about to witness in the Mass. The Sacrifice of Christ, His living presence. Dress like you normally would for Sunday.
4. Set the Scene: If you are streaming from your phone, computer, or television; help yourself get into a prayer atmosphere by eliminating regular house distractions. Put pets away, turn off unnecessary electronics, place a crucifix or other holy images near your worship space.
5. Participate fully in Mass: We love to see the engagement on our social media page, but don't let typing or looking who is online distract you. Respond, stand, sit, and kneel as if you were here in the church.
6. Make a spiritual Communion: For many of us this is something new. Not being able to receive Jesus fully present in the Sacrament of the Eucharist is disheartening, but we can not let that get in the way of being spiritually in Communion with God.

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.
